COORDINATED COMMUNITY RESPONSE (CCR)


An interagency effort to institutionalize practices that centralize victim safety and offender accountability, and build community capacity to effectively intervene and prevent domestic violence

THE WORK OF A CCR


Change what organizes an intervening agency/practitioner to take action on a case

COORDINATING RURAL INTER-AGENCY RESPONSES TO VAW

1. Identify gaps
2. Implement solutions
 - ❖ practice changes in policy, protocol, procedures etc.
3. Monitor/ evaluate results

CCR COORDINATOR


- Identify gaps
- Identify potential solutions
- Facilitates an interagency process for change

Ad hoc


- Brings selected decision-makers together to explore and implement changes
- keeps group/ process on task
- move process forward
- Etc.

Ongoing team, task force (optional)

LARGE GROUP

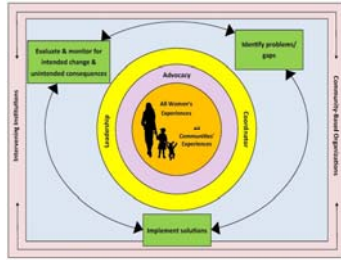


- Supports coordinator, practice/ policy change focus
- Support interagency effort: educate, celebrate, disseminate
- Reviews periodic updates: progress reports, tracking & monitoring results
- Community engagement activities
- Breaks up into committees

METHODS TO IDENTIFY GAPS



- On-going conversation & dialogue with women and advocates
- Talking with other communities
- Systems response concerns procedure

METHODS TO IDENTIFY GAPS

- Document women's experiences
 - Routine inquiry and compilation
 - Targeted surveys and interviews
 - Focus groups
- Practitioner observations and interviews
- Advocacy-initiated response
- Tracking and monitoring activities
- Text analysis – laws, rules, administrative practices
- Other

FOCUS GROUPS

- Women talk about their experience and impact on their lives
- Themes identified

E-learning example: focus groups

- women discuss the experience of being battered and then arrested as offenders
- what it's like to become victim-defendant.

AIR: WHAT IS IT?

- Law enforcement notifies advocacy program asap following a domestic violence related call
- Advocate initiates contact with victim of violence as soon as possible following notification by law enforcement
- Departure from traditional model of waiting for the victim to make the first contact

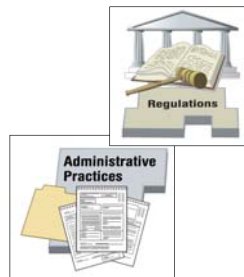

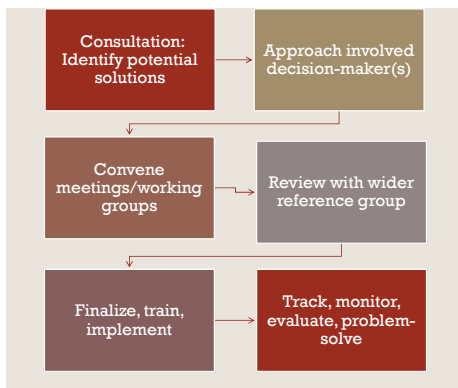


IDENTIFY SOLUTIONS
