Appendix 7E Monitoring Conditions of Probation in Domestic Violence Cases

The supervising probation officer shall monitor the probationer according to the following standards:

- 1. Work with the probationer to selected the appropriate services and conduct follow-up meetings with the probationer prior to, during, and after programming.
- 2. Check for any new contacts the probationer has had with law enforcement officers, including: (a) contacts resulting in arrest, (b) contacts not resulting in arrest, and (c) instances of law enforcement being called to the probationer's location but the probationer leaving before officers could contact him or her.
- 3. Check on the probationer's overall compliance with the program.
- 4. Check on the probationer's attempts to get a gun permit.
- 5. Check for new offenses charged or warrants issued against the probationer.
- 6. Review monthly verification provided by probationer of compliance with all conditions.
- 7. Require alcohol and drug testing in appropriate cases.
- 8. With the victim's permission, contact his/her workplace or school regarding the no-contact order if the probationer and victim have a workplace or school in common.
- 9. Monitor firearms compliance. Conduct house or welfare checks.
- 10. Follow up on contacts the probationer had with law enforcement investigative units.
- 11. Give notice of possible non-compliance to programs working with the probationer.
- 12. Verify restitution.
