### OTHER CRIMINAL @USTICE SYSTEM © CCR PROBLEMS

- Strangulation often overlooked
- Deadly weapon enhancements often dropped
- Domestic violence cases dismissed, charges reduced at an alarming rate
- Charges dropped if the victim is too scared to testify
- Judge won allow evidence based prosecution
- Won allow expert testimony
- Judges who refuse to meet with dv programs, attend training, ccr meetings, or get involved in inter®gency efforts because they are seen as special interest and they need to be "unbiased"
