### WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT RURAL ADVOCACY: (A FEW 2013 RURAL ASSESSMENT FINDINGS)

- "Rural" means many different things...references diverse geographies, populations, and cultures that are both shared and distinct, and include sovereign Tribal governments.
- Advocates are the leaders of meaningful, sustained responses to violence against women in rural communities.
- When sufficiently supported, advocates recognize and develop community partners within their local agencies and systems.

#### WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT RURAL ADVOCACY: (A FEW 2013 RURAL ASSESSMENT FINDINGS)

- Cultural traditions and assumptions vary tremendously and shape how rural communities respond to violence against women.
- Rural communities are creative at "making do" and managing scarce resources.
- "Everybody knows everybody"; relationships are highly valued and slowly built.
