


























Mandatory Reporting Laws: To Whom Do They Apply?

- STIs &/or other "reportable diseases"

















VAWA Allows Release of Information if... • Release is compelled by - statute, - court mandate, or - victim consent






VAWA's Conditions for Mandated Release


 Reasonable attempts to notify victims affected; and . . .

VAWA's Conditions for Mandated Release (cont.) • Take steps necessary to protect - privacy and - safety of persons affected by release of information.



Title IX: Overview • Prohibits sex discrimination • Federal \$ • Interim measures • Prompt and equitable response • Limited confidentiality • Preponderance standard








Practice Tips

- Discuss confidentiality at the outset
- Don't over-promise
- Protect privacy when you collaborate
- Address technology and remote services
- Vary meeting locations, parking
- Use appropriate interpreters and translators
- · Consider minors' privacy
